



VOTING IS A CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY

The Mayoral Election on **November 4** has important consequences for the Jewish Community

DEADLINE TO REGISTER IS OCTOBER 24TH

You are eligible to vote if:

1. You are a registered voter in New York City

Step 1: REGISTER:

If you have a legal residence in NY City, please register to vote here:

<https://e-register.vote.nyc/registration>

(The deadline for registering in the 2025 NYC mayoral election is October 25, 2025 but DO NOT WAIT – do it today!)

STEP 2: Apply online for an early mail-in ballot here:

We find that the best way to ensure that everyone votes, is by choosing **early ballot mail-in voting**.

- Go to <https://requestballot.vote.nyc>, and choose to get the **Early Mail Ballot**.
- This ballot will be mailed to you on or around September 19, or shortly after you request it.
- Follow the instructions carefully for filling out the ballot.

STEP 3: Mail in the Early Mail Ballot

- You should return the mail-in ballot immediately.

(Technically it can be mailed up to right before election day, but DO NOT WAIT.)

Gap Year Students

If your child is going to Israel for a gap year, or if you or someone else needs to vote by absentee ballot:

- They must first register to vote at <https://e-register.vote.nyc/registration>
- They can then request an **Early Mail ballot** at <https://requestballot.vote.nyc>
- This ballot will be sent after September 19" to the requested address outside the US

College and Graduate School Students

If you or your child will be dorming in NYC, attending college or graduate school, they can and should establish their domicile in NYC and vote in the elections. Follow the steps above for registering and requesting an Early Mail Ballot.
